WorkKeys Job Profiling and Assessment, a division of the ACT assessment used by most colleges, tests people in the areas of problem solving, communication, and teamwork. It also identifies the skill levels needed to do specific jobs, so students can learn where they need improvement to obtain the job of their choice. Job Analysis is also performed to identify physical job demands. The results provide employers with valid information about each job so that potential employees' performance abilities can be tested prior to hiring. Ultimately, the goal of WorkKeys is to develop a job market where students and employees in their communities are adequately prepared for higher-skill, higher-wage jobs.
